- [1] **CONSIDERING** the allegations contained in Applicant LOYAL ENTREPOT EXPRESS INC.'s *Amended Originating Application for a Provisional Injunction, Interlocutory Injunction and Permanent Injunction*, the affidavits filed in support of the application, and the exhibits presented to the Court;
- [2] **CONSIDERING** Respondent SYNDICAT DES TRAVAILLEUSES ET TRAVAILLEURS DE PJC ENTREPOT – CSN's consent to the conclusions sought herein;
- [3] **CONSIDERING** that the present judgment is not to be interpreted as an admission of the facts as alleged in the present proceedings;

FOR THESE REASONS, THE COURT:

[4] **GRANTS** the present Interlocutory Injunction, to remain in force until final judgment;

ORDERS Respondent, its representatives, officers, agents, employees and any other person acting under their control or with their consent or knowledge:

- i. not to block the entry, exit or any other access to any of the warehouses of Applicant, namely:
 - a. 8455 Henri Bourrassa E, Montréal, Quebec, H1E 1P4;
 - b. 8465 Henri Bourrassa, Montréal, Quebec, H1E 1P4;
 - c. 8475 Henri Bourrassa, Montréal, Quebec, H1E 1P4;
 - d. 8275 Marco Polo, Montreal, Quebec, H1E 7K1;

especially for its trucks, transport vehicles, employees, officers, agents, representatives or any other person on the Premises, seeking access to the Premises or leaving the Premises;

- ii. not to enter Applicant's private property or the Premises and to keep at least 10 m away from the exterior limits of same;
- iii. limit the number of protesters to ten (10) persons at any given time and within range of any given entry or exit point of the Premises;
- iv. not to harm, obstruct, assault, insult, intimidate, or attempt to harm, obstruct, assault, insult, or intimidate the truck drivers, employees, officers, agents or representatives of Applicant on the Premises, seeking to access the Premises or leaving from the Premises or off the Premises;
- v. not to engage in any form of violent conduct targeting Applicant or its employees, officers, agents, directors, representatives or any other person on the Premises, seeking to access the Premises or leaving from the Premises or off the Premises;
- vi. not to harm or block the normal business activities of the Applicant;
- vii. not to damage, vandalize or attempt to damage or vandalize the property and Premises of the Applicant;

ORDERS Respondent to inform all its members, employees, agents, representatives, officers or any other person acting under their control or with their consent or knowledge of the present injunction;

ALLOWS Applicant to serve the present proceedings and judgment to be rendered beyond the regular hours of service, as well as on non-judicial days, by communicating copy via email to representatives of Respondents, specifically: shawnyvt@hotmail.com (representative of *Syndicat des Travailleuses et Travailleurs de PJC Entrepot – CSN*) and yanick.vezina@csn.qc.ca (legal counsel for Respondent), and reduce the delays for service, as may be required;

- [8] **DISPENSES** Applicant from providing surety;
- [9] **PERMIT** any peace officer of the SPVM, or any peace officer having jurisdiction to act in the district of Montreal, to assist with the enforcement of the present order;
- [10] **THE WHOLE**, without costs.
